By our records, Bhagawan Baba Blessed the city of Mumbai when He was 36 year of age; He attended a private Bhajan session on Malabar Hill in the residence of one Bhatia family. Every time when the bhajans were subsequently continued on Thursdays, the entire road leading to the residence used to be filled with the fragrance of Vibhuthi. Once a devotee enquired from Swami the significance of this miracle. Baba replied that the fragrance indicates His presence where His Name is extolled!
